#### MONDAY NIGHT NET CONTROL OPERATOR'S SCHEDULE FOR DECEMBER – JANUARY



**Mission Accomplished!** More than a dozen operators assembled in the pre-dawn cold at Banner Island Ball Park for the 11th Annual Run/Walk Against Hunger.

This event benefits local families unable to provide adequate food for themselves at times of personal or financial crisis. Your volunteering and sharing your Thanksgiving with those in need helped raise over \$120,000 for the Emergency Food Bank! In addition to all that cash, a truck load, and I mean a BIG TRUCK LOAD of donated food and other items was hauled off to the Food Bank at the end of the event.

The Plan put together by Paul KC6RRR was executed flawlessly. Everyone assembled at Net Control and were on the course well before the streets were shut down by Stockton PD. A pre-event briefing by Paul KC6RRR, and Net Control Ops John NZ6Q and Paul N6KZW answered last minute questions as well as distributing safety vests to all operators. Pre-race logistics were handled with course set-up. Thank you to David AA6HO and Dave N6LHL for checking on the bathrooms at Morelli Park. It was discovered there were operational issues with the Mens bathroom and no supplies (ie TP) in the bathrooms. Net Control made calls to the city and a Maintenance crew was dispatched and handled the problem before participants made it to that point. Besides being the 'halfway mark', Morelli Park has the only bathrooms on the course.
