#### APRIL MEETING REPORT STOCKTON-DELTA AMATEUR RADIO CLUB APRIL 14<sup>TH</sup> 2016 7:30 PM

The April 14 2016 meeting was called to order at 7:30PM by Vice President Guy W6MSU. After a round of interdictions, Paul N6KZW demonstrated a new headset that he acquired on line and has been receiving good reports on the air about the sound quality. The headset was only \$50.00.

Paul N6KZW reported on the success of the 'rained on" swap meet on April 9<sup>th</sup>. Which brought in some donations to the club.

There was no 'formal' treasurer's report.

John NZ6Q reported on the April 9<sup>th</sup> HamCram and walk-in test session. John reported the switch to new Laurel VE software based testing which cut the wait time for a new license from two weeks to as little as 48 hours. While the software based test session is a little more work on the part of the VEs, the speed to license is well worth it. This will get new licensees on the air days after their test rather than weeks and will help recruiting more club members. We had over 20 people attend the test session with 15 new Technician licenses issued, 4 General upgrades and 2 Extra Class upgrades. We had a 9 year old test, but did not pass and a 12 year old who tested and passed his Technician. The new software tests can accommodate individuals with special needs as well. Persons with limited vision or trouble reading can request the test be 'blown up' to twice its size or larger to help someone with a special need.

Guy W6MSU read the final nominations for President. Paul N6KZW withdrew his nomination and Charlie WB6NVB was elected to fill the rest of Dan Kl6FTT's term.

"Get Your License in a Saturday" is the perfect solution to getting your ham radio license in today's busy world. No tedious preliminary home study. No long, boring once-a-week classes. You attend for just one day, 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM, and you're done.

The term "Elmer" means someone who provides personal guidance and assistance to would-be hams. The term first appeared in *QST* in a March 1971 "How's DX" column by Rod Newkirk, W9BRD (now also VA3ZBB). Newkirk called them "the unsung fathers of Amateur Radio." Stockton-Delta Amateur Radio Club, the Manteca Amateur Radio Club and the Lodi Amateur Radio Club have come together to help teach new hams how to get started and offer this "personal guidance".

These sessions are an opportunity for the new ham to learn how to purchase and / or program their first radio, to discover some of the many opportunities there are in Amateur Radio to "find your world" and give the new ham just the chance to ask questions and get on the air.

Elmering session starts at 9:00 AM and finishes at 2:00 PM concurrent with our HamCram testing sessions.

The class is structured with a 50 minute "classroom" sessions in the morning, break for lunch and afternoon "on the air" sessions using new HTs, VHF/UHF Mobile radios and HF radios.
