MAY MEETING NOTES

President Charlie **WB6NVB** opened the meeting at 7pm with thanks to all who attended tonight's meeting at Eddie's Pizza. He congratulated and thanked all the operators who supported the Saturday, May 4 March for Babies and the operators who supported the Sunday, May 5 Delta Century Bike Ride. Those who worked both events were recognized for the extra effort they made.

Dave **N6LHL** is seeking one more operator for the May 19 Avenue of the Vines half marathon run from Woodbridge winery. He and John **NZ6Q** further described the use of APRS for tracking a sag wagon at this event.

Treasurer Peter **KD6CPA** made all aware of upcoming expenses to the club: rent for the repeater site, contribution to the church for our meeting room, annual website charge and our liability insurance bill. He pointed out we have sufficient funds in our account to cover all expected expenses.

Glen **K6KJQ** requested permission to expand the already existing 444.575 repeater through the installation of two additional receivers to be located, one at North Stockton and another in Lodi. This led to a long and convoluted discussion over technical aspects of the project, possible interference with the W6SF voter, and our mutual understanding of the project. Glen pointed out that interference is a non-issue because transmissions would not be sent to the repeater via airwaves, but would be done on a phone line to the repeater. This phone line is already in place. Glen asked for permission to spend \$200 for the crystals. Charlie asked Glen to invite our benefactor to our **June 13** meeting.

Charlie is working to set up an ATV demonstration in July, and an APRS demonstration in August. He further advised all that his DeVries Road wheat field is available for Field Day. (June 22 & 23) However, it is now planted in grapes so there is not room for an 80 meter dipole. A signup sheet for Field Day shirts was sent around.

Tobin **KJ6YVH** asked if anyone is interested in putting on a ham radio demonstration at a local Stockton school. We will discuss it further next month.

Thanking all for attending, the meeting was adjourned.

MAY 4 MARCH FOR BABIES WALK

On Saturday morning, May 4th, a picture-perfect day greeted both the March for Babies participants as well as SDARC volunteers who gathered in support of this charity event. This years event was held on the UC Stanislaus Downtown Stockton campus which was formally part of the State Hospital grounds. Fitting a 5K walk-a-thon into an enclosed space without the walkers taking 2 laps posed to be challenging and we received the final route only days before the event.

This proved to be challenging as previous routes had the walk exiting the campus onto California Street and back at Harding Way. This would have required a much larger pool of volunteers to be "eyes and ears" for the event as it exited onto city streets and then back onto the campus. The final route was able to keep the event inside the fence with a number of twists and turns making it a lot of fun. It also perfectly fit the number of volunteers we had committed and allowed us to try some new things.

For primary communication, we decided to test the capabilities of David Coursey's N5FDL repeater on 147.210 (+ PL 114.8) for providing portable coverage in the area. This repeater is located on the Coronado St tower in central Stockton. We also had available Glen, **K6KJQ'**s UHF repeater on 444.325 (+ PL 94.8) as back-up along with 147.570 as simplex. The 147.210 repeater proved to be very reliable and provided excellent HT coverage in the area.

The new venue opened at 8AM and all operators were ready and in place by 0845. Supporting the event were, as Net Control, Eric, **W6INP**; At rest stops Shirl, **AA6K**, Charlie, **WB6NVB**, Dean, **KJ6EML**, Kevin K6KBQ, David N5FDL; John, **NZ6Q** rode the course on his bicycle as "Rover 1" keeping up with the 300 - 400 participants as they weaved their way through the campus to complete the 5K walk. Paul, **N6KZW** walked through the course taking a number of pictures. A hearty THANK YOU to each and every one.

There were not only individual walkers, but also a number of team-walkers representing local businesses, and also families who have or had a child born prematurely. Event Staff were very thankful to have radio operators at each rest stop as their "eyes and ears" and demonstared their appreciation with T-shirts for each club member as well as complimentary breakfast and lunch - love those chili dogs!

The March of Dimes "Walk for Babies" is held each year as a fundraiser and to promote awareness of the struggles for both families and children who are born pre-maturely or with birth defects. After the walk, there was as very touching program which featured a release of doves to commemorate those premie babies which 'didnt make it' over the last year.

CROSS-BANDING

Cross-banding is the process of receiving on a VHF frequency and retransmitting on a UHF frequency, vice-versa. Most dual band radios have this feature. While reception may be very good on a base station, using a hand-held radio in a structure can be spotty at best. Using the cross-band feature allows you to transmit and receive from a hand-held radio with good results.

This practice is becoming favorable, but with little regard to the rules and consequences. Without caution, it is easy to unknowingly cross-band to either the input, or the output of an active repeater, causing interference. In addition, using a national simplex frequency is highly discouraged. Cross-banding from a repeater, or to a repeater should be approved by the respective org rep.

Example #1 A newly licensed amateur in the Pine Grove area has been cross-banding to the input of 444.325 here in Stockton. The signal strength is extremely poor, but is adequate to activate the repeater, retransmitting 90% noise.

Example #2 During the May 5 SDARC event, someone was cross-banding the event to 446.000, the national calling frequency.

When using this feature, please know exactly what you are doing. There are many seasoned SDARC members, willing to guide you through the proper procedure. Failure to do so could result in an FCC violation.
