CLUB MEMBERS AID "PEDELING PATHS TO INDEPENDENCE" RIDE Saturday, February 23 dawned clear and cold, but all were pleased to be rain-free. Fifteen hams met in front of DeVinci's restaurant in Linden to provide radio support for the fifth annual Pedaling Paths to Independence bike ride in support of the Stockton Center for the Blind and Visually impaired. Hams provided communications to tie the 65 mile and 25 mile bike routes together so the riders would be assured of a quick response if a problem arose preventing them from completing their course. Three rest stops were manned by **W6RPM** Ron and **WB6NVB** Charlie at Farmington Fire Station; by **W6PJF** Lynette and **W6INP** Eric Chapa at the Milton Masonic Temple; by **K6DGQ** Bob and **W6MRM** Mike at Sheldon Road in Bellota. Net control was staffed by **N6LHL** Dave and John **NZ6Q**. Several members of the Tracy and Manteca clubs also pitched in. A big vote of thanks for their participation. The Linden Lions provided a number of drivers and they also deserve out thanks. Over 300 bike riders pedaled the course.

ARRL SEEKS MORE FREQUENCY ALLOCATIONS

The ARRL filed a Petition for Rulemaking with the FCC, asking it to amend Sections 2 and 97 of its rules and create a domestic Amateur Radio allocation at 472-479 kHz, conforming to the allocation status and limitations set forth in the international Radio Regulations and as approved at the 2012 World Radio Communication Conference.

The FCC issued a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, seeking to give primary status of the entire amateur portion of the 160 meter band to the Amateur Radio Service. It also proposed a new LF amateur band at 135.7-137.8 kHz.
