HR 4969 NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT IN CONGRESS

In June, 2014 **HR 4969 - the "Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2014"** - was introduced into the 113th Congress. This bipartisan effort would direct the FCC to extend the "reasonable accommodation" provisions for Amateur Radio antennas to include all types of land-use regulation, including deed restrictions and restrictive covenants.

If enacted, HR 4969 would direct the FCC to extend the the reasonable accommodation protections to those amateurs who are living in deed-restricted communities. Known as "CC&Rs" (covenants, conditions and restrictions) are the prohibitions and limitations placed on properties by builders or home-owner associations (HOAs) which prevent licensed Amateurs from erecting even modest antennas.

In 1985, PRB-1 was passed which directed state and local governments to provide "reasonable accommodations" for Amateur Radio operators to erect antennas. While over the years there have been horror stories about "unreasonable restrictions" attempted by governments, most cities and counties do provide for reasonable accommodation. HR 4969 would extend that power over CC&Rs. Most importantly, it will ensure that every ham in the US, regardless of the community they live in, will have the opportunity to practice their avocation from their own homes without breaking any rules or fear of reprisal.

Many of our communities here have such CC&Rs which significantly restrict our members abilities to enjoy the hobby. This important legislation needs the support of every Amateur Radio operator to get it passed through Congress and signed into law.

N6XMA NEW ANTENNA PROJECT UPDATE



Ed, **N6XMA**'s new vertical antenna was only on the air a few days and it developed a problem. On Saturday, August 23rd, Paul, **N6KZW** and John, **NZ6Q** took to the roof of his apartment building to check out the issue.

The antenna was not tuning up correctly on any band and on the MFJ Analyzer seemed to indicate some sort of open circuit. We put a 50-ohm load on the end of the coax to verify that it was OK. The same meter connected to the SO-239 at the base of the antenna reveled that to be the culprit. Using a short piece of coax and another SO-239, we created a new point for the coax to connect on a short 'pigtail'.

This immediately resolved the problem and Ed is once again back on HF and ready to check into the Thursday night 10-Meter net.

ARRL OFFERS NEW FREE ON-LINE TESTING

The ARRL has launched a new online resource that allows users to take randomly generated practice exams using questions from the actual examination question pool. **ARRL Exam Review for Ham Radio**TM is *free*, and users do *not* need to be ARRL members. The only requirement is that users must first set up a site login. Check it out at http://www.arrl.org/exam-practice

While ARRL Exam Review is being introduced with the new, third edition of the Technician study guide, *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual*, the site also supports practice examinations for General and Amateur Extra. The on-line exam practice provides different review options, so you can choose to review by chapter of the study manual or by question pool topic. Short explanations are provided to help you understand the correct answer. The software also provides the option to produce-- and print-- as many practice exams as you would like.
