At 10:18AM on 10-18-2012 (catchy huh) a simulated earthquake drill will occur state-wide. Ed, N6XMA, will be net-control as we establish a simulated disaster net on the W6SF 2M & 440 repeaters. Club members are encouraged to check-in at that time wherever they may be and report on their status and their capabilities. An exchange might be something like this:

Net Control: "N6XMA taking check-ins for the drill"

NZ6Q: "NZ6Q, John in Stockton"

Net Control: "NZ6Q, your status and capabilities"

NZ6Q: "NZ6Q is mobile with HF, 2m/440 mobile & portable & APRS"

If you're at home, check in at home. If you're at work, ask your supervisor if you can take 5 minutes and participate in this event.
