PEDDLING PATHWAYS TO INDEPENDENCE FEBRUARY 22ND 7:30AM

On Saturday, February 22ND, the Stockton Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired will be holding their annual bike ride Peddling Pathways to Independence". This annual event is held to raise money to support its activities for its San Joaquin County clients.

For the last 5 years, the Stockton-Delta ARC has provided radio communications between rest stops, the start/finish line and SAG wagons. This year we will need operators at Linden, Sheldon Road, Farmington, Milton, and also up to 5 sag wagons. We are looking for a minimum of 15 – 20 volunteers. We will also incorporate APRS in the SAG wagons to allow net control to track and dispatch the nearest crew to any reported incidents.

The foothill terrain around Linden, Farmington, Milton & Jenny Lind can be problematic for 5 watt HTs. A good mobile radio producing 10 watts or more with a good antenna, (5/8 wave or better) is encouraged. If you are going to use an HT, I encourage you to order one of the many "Hershey Kiss" mag-mount antennas available on e-bay for under \$20. Pretty much any SMA or BNC connector is available to match your HT and while confining you to within a few feet of your car (or other improvised ground plane), they do make a difference.

This is a great event for a great cause and I hope you will plan now and put the 22nd of February on your calendar to attend. A sign-up sheet will be available at the January and February club meetings. Last year's 340 riders, and 52 sponsors raised over \$16,000 to continue vital programs for the blind and visually impaired here in San Joaquin County. The Mother Lode DX / Contest Club is proud to have John Miller, K6MM, present an overview of the recent Commemorative DXpedition to Wake Atoll at our January 25th meeting to be held at The Old Spagetthi Factory, March Lane at I-5 in Stockton. Lunch meeting starts at 11:30AM, presentation to follow.



John was first licensed as WV2BQJ in 1958 while living in Syracuse, NY. In 1976, John's career took him to Silicon Valley, where he reconnected with amateur radio in the late 90s. For the last decade, John has focused heavily on DXing, contesting, and recruiting new operators into the hobby. His current DXCC total stands at 327 confirmed. He holds 8BDXCC, working on completing 160M for the 9th band. His article entitled "The No Excuses 160M Vertical" won the cover plaque award for the June 2009 issue of QST.

He was an operator in the <u>PJ7E DXpedition</u> to Sint Maarten, as they celebrated their special day of independence on 10-10-10.

John is a member of ARRL, INDEXA, MLDXCC, and PAARA. He is Past-President of the Northern California Contest Club, a Director of the Northern California DX Club, a founding member of the CW Operators' Club, a member of the editorial staff of the National Contest Journal, and a Director of the Northern California DX Foundation. He is also the co-chair for the 2013 International DX Convention in Visalia, CA.

This is a great opportunity not only to hear and learn about an exciting DX-pedition, but also to fellowship with members of the MLDXCC and other clubs who will be in attendance.

Kids Day is designed to give on-the-air experience to youngsters and hopefully foster interest in getting a license of their own. It is also intended to give older hams a chance to share their station and love for Amateur Radio with their children.

Kids Day always runs from 1800 UTC through 2359 UTC (10:00 AM to 4:00PM PST). Operate as much or as little as you like. The suggested exchange is your name, age, location and favorite color. This should be appropriate depending on the age of the child in your shack or on the air. Be sure to work the same station again if an operator has changed. To draw attention, call "CQ Kids Day."
