

ham". Seemingly never too busy to share his vast knowledge of this great hobby with the newcomer, active in the Lodi Amateur Radio Club as far back as I can remember. Jim organized the first "mobile round-ups" in Lodi as well as participated in nearly every operating event.

Ron, N6GKJ in the Lodi Club newsletter wrote:

Jim Seiferling was a good friend and mentor to all. I met Jim during one of the ARRL VHF Contests. As I got to know Jim, I learned he was from Lodi. I told Jim about our fledgling club. He showed up at the net meeting and has been here ever since. Jim was a strong supporter of our club. His knowledge and experience were a great resource and benefit to all. I became good friends with Jim, and in time came to love him as a brother. Jim's reputation and kindness was one of the reasons our club has flourished and grown. I will miss him and his wisdom... REST in Peace old friend...

Jim always had a great story to tell and a warm smile on his face... In his QRZ.COM page he wrote about his ham radio story....

I was first licensed in September 1962, as novice, WN6BET. My first contact was with Orrie Grefsheim, WA6UYD (SK) three blocks away! He became an Elmer for a number of future hams, in Lodi, California. I obtained the technician class, the next year, as WB6BET and was very active on 6, 2, & 423. I built a station, with other local hams, for working OSCAR III. After graduating from Lodi High School, in 1967, I let my license lapse...

In the summer of 2008, I decided to get my license back. I took the technician and general, at

the same session in October 2008. I then applied for my original call sign, WB6BET. It had been 41 years, since my last contact on the air...

My wife is licensed as KI6YYT, passed her general in March 2010, and completed her worked all states in February 2011. She has currently worked 115 DXCC entities...

Like many others, I will sorely miss Jim WB6BET and cherish the knowledge he gave so freely to all of us...

# Announcing "The 2021 Reindeer Roundup" 2 Meter VHF Contest SATURDAY DEC 4<sup>TH</sup> 10:00 AM

What: A simplex sprint style contest. Where: 2 meter FM simplex frequencies

When: Saturday, December 4, 2021 from 10am to

11am

Who: Open to any licensed radio amateur. No club

affiliation is required.

Why: To introduce contesting to a larger population

of hams.

Object: To make as many two-way QSO's with as

many different hams as possible.

Sponsoring Organization: Shirley L Rose Memorial DXCC, AD6KU.



#### Rules:

The station calling CQ and completing a QSO must change frequency and allow the answering station to use that frequency.

For example: W6AB is on 146.430 calling CQ. He is answered by AD6KU. The exchange is successfully made. Now W6AB must change frequency and AD6KU may call CQ on 146.430 until he makes a successful QSO **or** he can also change frequency leaving that frequency open for use by anyone. See the section on Exchange below.

#### Categories:

There will be four categories for this contest.

#### **Proposed Categories (2021)**

- A) Home station, no power or antenna limits.
- B) Mobile/Portable station, no power limits.
- C) Handheld Transceiver, with an <u>attached</u> antenna (can be a different antenna than stock)
- D) Mentor class, no power limits. This class will be scored as a team. The mentor must teach a ham with less than 2 years of experience. A mentor can assist in logging and changing the frequency of the radio. Contacts will only be made by the new ham, using his/her call sign.

For <u>all categories</u> you can enlist an additional person to do <u>logging only</u>. They <u>do not</u> have to be a licensed ham, but could be. This is to encourage persons that might be interested in ham radio the opportunity to see what this aspect of ham radio is all about. Please practice safe COVID procedures.

#### **Proposed Modified & Additional Wording (2021).**

No mobiles in motion. You <u>can</u> work in one fixed location from your vehicle (i.e. your driveway, parking lot or garage, mountain top, etc.). <u>Mobile or Portable stations must remain stationary for the full time of the event.</u> For this contest, mobile and portable are in the same category.

For a mobile station, the top of the antenna can not be more that 12 feet above the ground. The vehicle must be able to be driven on all roads, at speed, with the antenna in place.

A portable station is a temporary setup, <u>NOT</u> contained <u>in</u> your vehicle or house. Power for that station must be independent of your vehicle or home. A portable station is <u>NOT</u> limited by antenna height.

This is a single radio contest. The use of more than one transceiver or scanner is prohibited.

#### Exchange:

Give your call sign, your serial number

For example:

K6AB calls: "CQ CQ K6AB VHF Sprint"

AD6KU answers: "AD6KU"

K6AB replies: "AD6KU, this is K6AB, number 2."

AD6KU replies "Copy number 2, this is AD6KU, number 6."

K6AB changes frequency having completed contact.

AD6KU has option of staying on that frequency and calling CQ or also moving.

K6AB may also politely reply by saying, "AD6KU, the frequency is yours".

#### Scoring:

1 point for each complete QSO.

Stations may only contact any given station 1 time during the contest for QSO points.

We hams are honest.

QSO'S MADE THROUGH REPEATERS ARE NOT ALLOWED!!

#### Frequencies:

Use only these frequencies for **this** contest.

It is suggested to take the time to program this group of frequencies into your radio.

Note: Off limits=146.520 is National Calling Frequency and is usually busy with SOTA activations



#### **Soliciting QSOs:**

No prearranged QSO's at all are permitted! The use of any method of communications to make a pre-planned QSO (ie: phone, e-mail, text, carrier pigeon, smoke signals, drums etc.) is not in the spirit of this event. The goal of this contest is to test your ability to make contacts without any pre-planning. Contest entrants may not transmit on repeaters or repeater frequencies

for the purpose of soliciting contacts.

#### Prizes:

Certificates will be awarded to the top three scoring entrants in each category.

Additional certificates will be awarded to hams that have been licensed less than 2 years, applicable to all entry categories (A to D).

#### **Logging Format:**

Because this is a 1-hour contest you can just put the minutes down, like 00, 01, to 59. If you work more than 1 station within a minute, put that time down for each station worked.

Example: I work N6AB for my first: QSO in the contest, I work AD6KU for my second QSO in the contest. My log should look like this:

If any of the required information is incorrect or missing from a QSO, that contact is invalid and will not be scored. It is certainly acceptable to have more than one contact with the same time stamp, if you are working stations very fast.

After a quick debrief by Paul KC6RRR and distribution of this year's bright yellow volunteer shirt it was off to post for everyone except Kyle K6KDD, Mike K6AAN and John NZ6Q who had net control and start-finish line duties.







Their Leadership is looking for trained operators that can function WELL in the Incident Command environment. Showing up as "the guy with a radio" is no longer good enough. You need training and preparation. That is what ARES can do for you.

Start checking into the Tuesday night nets! If you're a new ham, welcome and learn. If you're already an ARES member, but haven't been active checking into the nets or the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday ZOOM meetings – get more active!

The goal for ARES is to have available a large enough group of properly trained Amateur Radio Operators to meet the needs of our served agencies. You can't get properly trained if you don't show up!

For those interested in where to start with your ARES (Amateur Radio Emergency Service) training modules, please contact Bob at <a href="mailto:n6tce@arrl.net">n6tce@arrl.net</a>. For you to be effective in ARES, you do need to be more than a person with a radio. You need to develop and maintain a specific and well-defined skill set around the Incident Command System, functioning in a disaster environment and more. Being able to send and receive traffic (messages) accurately and efficiently is important.

#### Note:

This is a fun contest. The more participants the better it will be. We trust you to be honest and a practice good sportsmanship. Handwritten logs must be legible. Illegible writing for any line item will make that contact invalid. If this contest is well received, we plan to make this a reoccurring event.

#### Operating Tips:

This type of contest has a very high duty cycle and can stress your transmitter. It will get warm to very hot. If possible, get a 12 volt fan on the heat sink of your radio. Remember that some radios, like the Kenwood 281A have a heat sink on both the back and the bottom. **Keep you rig cool, whether it's a handheld or base/mobile rig.** 

You can either scan the FM simplex frequencies listening for people to work, or you can call CQ on a simplex frequency. I would suggest calling,"CQ Sprint" or "CQ Contest", so people know that you're participating in a contest event.

It would also be a good idea to turn your <u>squelch off</u>, so you can hear weaker stations.

If you'd like to log with a computer, use software for the **CQ World Wide WPX contest**. This will make finding duplicates much easier.

Make sure you **copy the information from your QSO correctly**. If you have any question on an element of the exchange, ask for a repeat.

Hint: The exchange for this contest is simple; just his call and QSO number. **Speak each character slowly and clearly**. Maybe try using the pronunciation "Niner" for the number 9, and "Zero" for 0, never "Oh".

Hint. Get a copy of the standard phonetics and use them. It will help the new hams learn to copy call signs clearly. There are several good reference charts on the net. Look in Wikipedia for **NATO Phonetic Alphabet.** 

**READ THE RULES**, If you have any questions about anything regarding this contest, ask N6TCE **BEFORE** the contest starts.

**Disclaimer**: Participation in this contest is at your own risk. The Shirley L Rose Memorial DXCC accepts **no** liability of any incident that may occur while participating in the contest.

Remember: Rovers/Mobile operations are not allowed. Fixed portable is OK and encouraged. Contacts with a mobile that is not participating in the contest are allowed.

#### FITSAT-1 TO SEND MORSE CODE MESSAGES TO EARTH USING OPTICAL ARRAY CHRISTMAS EVE DECEMBER 24<sup>TH</sup>

On Christmas Eve (Dec. 24) the Japanese students who built FITSAT-1 are planning

to active the satellite's LED optical array and flash a message in Morse code to Earth. The Morse message may be visible to the unaided eye.

According to Takushi Tanaka JA6AVG the students plan to start testing the optical system at the end of November. The FITSAT-1 CubeSat was developed by students at the Fukuoka Institute of Technology (FIT) in Japan. In addition to the LED array it also has a CW beacon on 437.250 MHz, a data link on 437.445 MHz and a 5840.0 MHz data downlink.




