APRIL MEETING REPORT APRIL 14th 7:00 PM

The April meeting of the Stockton-Delta Amateur Radio Club was held at the Stockton Sailing Club Auditorium, 4980 Buckley Cove Rd in North Stockton on Thursday, April 14th starting at 7:00 PM.. The meeting was also held on ZOOM for those who could not attend in person.

The meeting began with introductions from both inperson and on-line attendees. There was a full house in the meeting room and on line. President Mark W6SXA opened the meeting by acknowledging how great it was to have new hams and old members alike back in person.

Mark W6SXA gave the floor to Joni Bauer from the Stockton Bicycle Club who gave the club an update on the 2022 Delta Century Ride to be held on Saturday April 30th. Joni was anxious to get a list of volunteers by the next club meeting so she could make sure that "box lunches" would be on hand for each volunteer. The start - finish will be held at Jessie's Grove Winery and more volunteers are needed to fill out this year's assignments.



At the January AGM, Club Membership dues for 2022 were raised to \$25 for an Individual Membership to help cover some upcoming costs associated with maintaining the W6SF repeater site. 2022 Dues are payable via PayPal from the W6SF website or by sending a check to the Treasurer Peter K6PH to the PO BOX

Mark W6SXA reported that STEAM Fest 2022, the annual Science Technology Engineering Art and Math event at Lincoln High School was a big success. The club gave away one SDR receiver at the event and two others afterwards in our raffle drawing. Bob K6DGQ's CW presentation along with Dave WB6TOU's Hi-Altitude Balloons were definite hits with those in attendence. Bob K6DGQ stated that several parents even got into trying out CW.

There was a report by John NZ6Q on Ham-U. Bob N6TCE reported on the HamCram at the LDS Church on "Ham Lane" in Lodi and 28 passed for new Tech or General, there were 4 General upgrades and one Extra Class upgrade.

The treasurers report included a loss of \$2285.00 to a fraudulent vendor email. The board went on to explain that they had taken steps to strengthen security measures in our financial controls and proposed a rule change in the bylaws to codify those changes going forward. After much discussion on the rule changes, the motion to change the bylaws was passed by a majority of those present in the meeting and on Zoom. The club bylaws page will be updated to reflect the new rules. After the business meeting, Mark W6SXA gave a thorough presentation on Antenna Tuners and their importance in your station; how they worked and how they protected your radio but did not necessarily make your antennas more efficient.

There were 20 members present in person, an additional 6 members and 1 guest (Joni Bauer) on Zoom. The meeting was adjourned at about 20:13 hours.

DELTA CENTURY RIDE SUCCESS APRIL 30TH 7:00 AM JESSE'S GROVE WINERY

The 2022 Delta Century Ride was held on Saturday April 30th.

We started setting up the NCS station at 6:00 AM. The Start/Finish was at Jessie's Grove Vineyard on Turner Rd just west of Lodi. Jessie's Grove was great to work with and we able to set up close to the registration tables and ride end point. Right by lunch!

Club members stepped up to support the ride with their own SAG vehicles and complete SAG wagon operation - Driver, radio, APRS GPS transceiver, bike tools and more. While there were also SAG operators from Stockton Bike Club, having radio and APRS significantly improved response times for the 18 riders that called in on the SAG hotline.

Rest stops along the routes were covered by 1 or 2 radio operators. Very few incidents were reported at rest stops. Bob K6DGQ and the crew at Courtland continually updated the net on numbers of riders thru the "hub" rest stop. The rides traverse the rural Delta roads of the San Joaquin Valley.



Flat quarter (26 miles), metric (62 miles), and full (100 miles) century loops cover scenic vineyard, farm, and Delta roads–and a ferry ride across Steamboat Slough (metric and full century routes only)–with rewarding rest stops along the way.

The goal for ARES is to have available a large enough group of properly trained Amateur Radio Operators to meet the needs of our served agencies. You can't get properly trained if you don't show up!

For those interested in where to start with your ARES (Amateur Radio Emergency Service) training modules, please contact Bob at <u>n6tce@arrl.net</u>. For you to be effective in ARES, you do need to be more than a person with a radio. You need to develop and maintain a specific and welldefined skill set around the Incident Command System, functioning in a disaster environment and more. Being able to send and receive traffic (messages) accurately and efficiently is important.

In addition to new call signs not being issued even if the applicant has paid the FCC fee, some applicants are also having issues paying and logging into the system.

Other types of license application transactions may also be experiencing problems. Applicants should expect delays with license, call sign, and application processing associated with individuals and amateur radio clubs.

Amateur radio license filings are currently on hold until further notice and FCC did not estimate how long the system would be down.

(Editor's Note) Some applications have been granted but overall the system is still having issues and VECs are not submitting new applications

FCC Not Processing New License Applications

4/27/2022

On Wednesday, April 27, in a notice to all <u>VECs</u>, the FCC again asked them to refrain from submitting any amateur radio exam session or license application files while the Commission works to resolve an issue with the Universal Licensing System (<u>ULS</u>) application filing system.

The <u>ULS</u> application filing system was not functioning properly last week and then the FCC indicated the problem was resolved, as previously reported by ARRL.

However, this was not the case, as no new amateur radio call signs and licenses have been issued since Monday, April 18, 2022.

Tuesday, April 19 is the day the FCC <u>application</u> <u>fees</u> became effective for amateur radio.

ARRL VEC Manager Maria Somma, AB1FM, reports that new call signs are not being assigned by the FCC even if the applicant has paid the FCC application fee.

The FCC was processing upgrade applications through the system without an issue because there are no fees required for those applications.




