ARRL Rookie Round Up - April 18, 2021

Most Amateurs overlook this short, 6 hour event. This year, consider opening up your shack and inviting a Rookie to come and operate.

From the Rookie Round-Up FAQ:

Q:I'm a non-Rookie; how can I help a Rookie?-

A: The easiest thing you can do to help a Rookie is to get on the air and work Rookies. However, helping your club get Rookies on the air is also very helpful. Your non-Rookie club members can open their shacks and allow a Rookie to operate, provide in-the-shack coaching to a Rookie, or act as a control operator to allow a Technician class licensee to operate in the General or Extra portion of the band (depending on your own license class). Information on being a control operator is found in FCC Part 97.105.

If you act as a control operator for a Rookie, be sure to observe the **Third-Party Traffic regulations**; It is *not* legal for unlicensed (or under-licensed) third parties to communicate on the air with amateurs or with other unlicensed third parties at amateur stations without a third-party traffic agreement in place. In general, many European countries do not have third-party traffic agreements with the US, but many South American and some African and Caribbean nations do. Information on third-party traffic regulations may be found **here**.

I am looking forward to more in-person meetings in the future.

In Amateur Radio, we have a saying:

"We can do this!"

Remember this: Amateur Radio has survived two World Wars with periods of Suspended/ Revoked license. We will survive the COVID-19 crisis.

button and state your call sign, your name, and your city or other location.





Radiomarine Department

RCA Global Communications - Radiomarine Department - maintains powerful medium- and high-frequency radiotelegraph stations in the United States, the Territory of Hawaii, and the Philippine Republic, for communication with ships at sea. Radio officers of all ships may make use of RCA coast station facilities when communicating with points in the U.S., the Hawaiian Islands, the Philippines, and all other overseas countries.

RCA's experienced coast station staffs will be pleased to assist in every way in routing messages to and from ships, and assure you of the fastest and the most dependable service for your marine messages.

CLASSES OF RADIOTELEGRAPH SERVICE

FULL RATE RADIOTELEGRAM(P)

The use of the 'Full Rate Radiotelegram' is recommended for the transaction of urgent business where rapid delivery is of the utmost importance.

Full rate radiotelegrams may be written in plain or secret language, or in a combination of both. Plain language words — in one of the languages approved for International communication — are counted at the rate of fifteen (15) letters to the word.

Secret language words consisting of groups of letters and/or groups of numbers are counted at the rate of five (5) characters to the word.

The detailed rates are shown in the 'Schedule of Charges' on page 12.

NIGHT RADIOTELEGRAM (NRT)

The 'Night Radiotelegram' is an overnight radiotelegraph service to destinations within the continental United States, which must be routed only via United States coast stations. It is recommended for radiotelegrams of a non-urgent nature.

Night Radiotelegrams (NRT) filed before midnight (Ship's Time) are delivered by telegraph at destination the following morning.

Charges for a twenty-two word 'Night Radiotelegram' and charges for additional words in this class of message are shown on page 12 of this brochure.

SEA LETTER TELEGRAM (SLT)

A radiotelegraph service known as 'Sea Letter Telegram' is available to ships on the high seas through the U.S. Coast Stations of RCA Communications, Inc. As the name implies, a message filed on a ship at sea is transmitted by radio to a coast station from which point it is forwarded by regular mail or by air mail, to any destination within the continental limits of the United States. SLT service is also available to addresses within the Hawaiian Islands, via Kahukuradio, Oahu, KHK.

RCA GIFT SERVICE (GFT)

By means of the 'Gift Service' anyone aboard ship can send gifts of Flowers, Candy, Fruit and Magazines to any destination in the United States. This is an excellent way to remember family and friends ashore on such occasions as birthdays, anniversaries, weddings, etc.

The fee charged for this service includes the cost of sending a radiotelegram appropriate for the occasion. It is \$1.60, to which is added the price of the gift and handling charges.

HOTEL RESERVATION SERVICE (HOTEL)

Through special arrangements with a large group of better hotels, passengers and ship's personnel are permitted to send radiotelegrams reserving accommodations in advance of arrival. Hotel Reservation messages are accepted without charge on board ship.

RCA Communications, Inc. guarantees the payment of tolls on such radiotelegrams when they are transmitted via RCA coast stations.

FREE MEDICAL ADVICE (DH-MEDICO)

All RCA coast stations furnish free medical advice to ships at sea through the facilities of the U.S. Public Health Service and the cooperation of the Western Union Telegraph Company.

No charge is made for any of the services rendered in this respect.

SPECIAL BROADCASTS (CQ)

RCA Coast Stations broadcast routine weather reports and traffic lists on regular schedules. See following pages.

Special bulletins on gales and hurricanes are broadcast immediately following all 'traffic list' broadcasts.

METEO MESSAGES (OBS)

Radio Officers of ships authorized to send Weather Observation messages from United States reporting areas will find RCA coast stations always ready to receive their METEO messages for transmission to the U.S. Weather Bureau, All charges for METEO messages to U. S. Reporting Offices are paid by the U.S. Weather Bureau and are not deblied to the vessel.

During the hurricane season, RCA coast stations will broadcast appeals for special weather reports from ships in storm areas. Ships receiving such broadcasts, and in a position to supply the desired meteorological information, are urged to forward their observations promptly to the United States Weather Bureau through any RCA or U.S. Government radio station.

LANDLINE FACILITIES

Direct 5-unit automatic landline circuits connect RCA's major coastal stations with Central Operations Offices in New York, San Francisco and Washington, D.C. Radio-telegrams forwarded through Chatham, Tuckerton or Lantana Radio on the Atlantic coast, or through San Francisco, in the Pacific Area, may be delivered to offices in these cities by RCA facilities exclusively and all stations have available the world-wide, international communications system of RCA for delivery of messages from ships at sea to any part of the world.

RCA coast stations in Continental United States are connected to the Western Union Telegraph Company landline system, through which messages may be sent from any coast station to any address in the United States, Canada or Mexico. All RCA coast stations have telephone service direct to the nearest shipping ports.

In addition, the following RCA coast stations are equipped with Bell System Teletypewriter service for direct communication with steamship companies and agents which also have this equipment available.
