

## PRESIDENT'S CORNER - Bob, N6TCE

#### Stockton-Delta Amateur Radio Club August 2020

Another month has passed and we are nearing the middle of our Summer weather. Our mornings are cool and soon we will notice dew on everything early in the morning, Certainly, Autumn will be around the corner.



The Board and I have been working hard in the background trying to find something interesting for the club each month. These are trying times for us all.

Autumn on the horizon brings to mind the California QSO Party (CQP) and planning has to start early. We can do this safely. John (NZ6Q) and I are planning to operate this event in San Joaquin County this year. Our goal is to exceed 1000 QSOs using the multi-op/multi-transmitter possibilities we explored during Field Day.

This year the Cal QSO party is operating a mini contest inside CQP. This is similar to what they did a few years back. This is from the cqp.org web page:

### The **SEQUOIA** Challenge

CQP 2020 includes a special award that commemorates the Northern California Contest Club's 50th anniversary, while also celebrating California's state tree, the mighty Redwood.

Here's how to get your colorful commemorative certificate:

• Participate in CQP and work a minimum of **100 QSOs**.

• Work seven of the special callsigns to spell out **SEQUOIA**. Look for special 1x1 callsigns ending in the letters S, E, Q, U, O, I, and A. There will be three of each on the air, for a total of 21 call signs (see chart below) -- so there will be many ways to win.

• Turn in your log.

Looks easy, isn't it? It is.

If you take a look at The Sequoia Challenge on the CPQ web page, you'll find that John NZ6Q and I have procured a special event call sign to use - W6Q. John reached out to the contest organizers at NCCC for this. Since *San JoaQuin County* is the only county in the state with a letter "Q" in its name, we wanted one of the 1-by-1 Q calls to be here in San Joaquin County. We are asking members of the Stockton-Delta ARC, the Lodi ARC, as well as Manteca ARC to help operate during the event. Because of the Mini Contest, the 1-by-1 callsigns that spell the word S-E-Q-U-O-I-A will be special targets for those operators working CQP this year.

Who would not want a little extra wallpaper for their Ham Shack?

I believe there is nothing in the rules which prevent you from working a shift at the county special event station and then working from your own shack.

Several members with artistic talent have discussed making up T-shirts like a DX-pedition would have or at least create a special "certificate of participation". Those which help log and operate will be included in the listing of operators and if we set a high enough score earn a Cal QSO certificate. Last year N6ESL working with K6EI achieved 534=CW contacts, 73=Phone contacts and 55=Multipliers for a total score of 96,140 points working as a Multi-radio/Multi-op, Low Power as an Expedition.

During the day we wish to have 15, 20 and 40 Meters active, (10 Meters is a maybe, we will have to watch the propagation predictions). During the night 40, 80 and 160 stations should be operating. At all times our plan is to have alternating operation of voice and CW on all open bands. With enough antenna separation and specific filters, we might be able to work CW and voice on the same bands. (last years' experience on the Lucid demonstrated that I could work FT8 on 20 and while Paul was working phone on the same band. The antennas were only 500 feet part.

COVID-19 strikes again. With the rise in new cases of COVID-19, The Board and I have agreed the risk is too high to have a picnic-BBQ as planned. It isn't safe yet to have this type of event.

So, we are going to have a virtual Picnic-BBQ in Zoom. Our presenter will be Mike K6MDS. We can open the Zoom meeting up early and club members are encouraged to share your Bar-B-Que masterpieces with the group before the start of the meeting.

We are also looking forward and have a person in mind for September's meeting presentation and it will deal with operations during a contest and how to be an effective operator. There is a specific mind, skill set and technique. Our presenter is a very avid and skilled DXer and contester. If you're a new ham and want to learn about radiosport to participate in CQP you do not want to miss the September meeting.

Your board and I are working hard to make the rest of the year, as exciting, friendly and safe as we can in these trying times.

Responding to the increasing demand from people wanting to get their Technician Class License or upgrade, we added several Test Only sessions at the Stockton Sailing Club.





## CHANGED TO TEST ONLY AT THE STOCKTON SAILING CLUB



In preparation for the W6SF participation in CQP 2020, we are hosting an outstanding speaker in September to take us into the world of Radiosport and Contesting.






