

In emergencies minutes count. In any emergency event, make your use of those minutes efficient and effective. We will be covering during our meeting how to effectively interface with 911 Emergency Call Centers.



The next session of Elmer University, now called "HAM-U" is scheduled for March 14th at Fire Station #2 Copsey Hall. This is where the newcomer begins



the journey of discovery and the seasoned veteran keeps informed of the latest technology in this huge hobby we call Amateur Radio. Regardless of where we are on our ham radio journey our local radio club is where we find our friends.

The term "Elmer" means someone who provides personal guidance and assistance to would-be hams. The term first appeared in *QST* in a March 1971 "How's DX" column by Rod Newkirk, W9BRD (now also VA3ZBB). Newkirk called them "the unsung fathers of Amateur Radio."



Stockton-Delta Amateur Radio Club, the Manteca Amateur Radio Club and the Lodi Amateur Radio Club want to help teach new hams how to get started and offer this "personal guidance".

These sessions are an opportunity for the new and experienced ham to discover some of the many opportunities there are in Amateur Radio to "find your world". There are also opportunities just to ask questions and get on the air.

Elmer University starts with a 30 minute "session-overview." This is followed by break-out sessions of various topics such as "Using DMR" "Digital Modes", "Building Go-Boxes", "Morse Code Basics", "Understanding & Building Antennas", "Ham Radio Contesting", "Good Operating Practices" and more depending on the volunteer instructors. The day concludes with a Q&A panel made up of several of the instructors. Attendees may select those sessions which are of most interest to them.

During the day, radio programming help and radio testing will be available to those who want assistance in programming or to check out their radio. Bring your radio.

There is ample parking at the Fire Station but we ask you to be mindful of "no parking" areas especially around the apparatus bay. Elmer University is held in one of the classrooms behind the training ground (mock city street). Register for Elmer University by clicking on the link below.



The Community Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired will be sponsoring its annual Pedaling Paths to Independence Century Bicycle Ride in Linden on Saturday February 22nd. The ride is an annual fund raiser to support activities for its San Joaquin County clients. Early registration numbers indicate we should have a very good event!

The Stockton-Delta ARC has provided radio communications between rest stops, the start/finish line and SAG vehicles every year. In fact, SDARC is listed as a "flagship supporter" on the PPIB website. This year we will staff operators at Rest Stops in Linden, Farmington, and Milton. We anticipate supporting as many as 5 SAG (Service and Gear) wagons with communications and vehicle location utilizing APRS. Last year we had a lot of volunteers, and this year will be one of our biggest operating events.



This year we will again be advertising to the riders in concert with the Stockton Bicycle Club our "Central Dispatch" phone number. Each rider will be given this number to call directly to the Net Control Station in the event of an emergency or break down. Using APRS in each of the SAG Wagons, Net Control will be able to track the locations of SAGs and 'dispatch' the closest SAG Wagon to the reported break-down or other incident.

Volunteers can look forward to DeVinci's Deli providing us with a delicious pasta and salad lunch at their Linden restaurant after their assignment.

Radio For the Rest of Us

For years, Amateur Radio Operators have stood ready to use Radio during emergencies like the Camp Fire Disaster in Paradise to help restore communications when normal communications fail. This has worked well to aid First Responders. However, it has become increasingly critical for the average citizen to also have alternative methods to communicate when cell phone and Internet services fail. Getting an Amateur Radio license requires passing a technical exam beyond the interests or capability of most average citizens. But there are viable radio alternatives that average citizens can use without passing a test or getting a Ham Radio license.

Radio For The Rest of Us highlights these cell phone and Internet service vulnerabilities, and how our unconscious over-reliance on cell phones for virtually everything puts us at serious risk. The presentation suggests ways how Amateur Radio Clubs might help "the rest of us;" our families, our friends, and our community, stay safer in the face of cell-phone and Internet service failures.

The Calaveras Amateur Radio Society CARS is looking for a few volunteers to help out at this years Ride & Walk 4 Art.



This meeting is at the Stockton E911 Center – Meet at the Eberhardt Building Weber Ave @ Center St in Downtown Stockton at 7:00 PM. Members and guests are welcome.

WEEKLY NETS: Held each Monday evening at 1900hrs is the W6SF New Ham/Tech Net hosted by Paul N6KZW and Others. Then at 2000hrs the regular club net starts. 147.165+ PL 107.2 Hz and 442.250 + PL 107.2 are the regular repeaters for these Nets. Members and visitors are invited to check in. There is also an unofficial get together on Thursday evenings (except meeting night) at 8:00pm on 28.457MHz. Amateurs with the proper license are encouraged to participate.

CLUB REPEATERS: Located in the Sierra at 2500 feet, the club repeater covers the southern Sacramento and Northern San Joaquin Valleys. The call sign is W6SF, and can be heard on **147.165+**Mhz with a PL tone of 107.2 Hz. From the same site, the club also operates a 440MHZ repeater at **442.250 +** with a PL of 107.2 Hz.

The club also operates a UHF repeater located in downtown Stockton **444.575MHz +** with a PL 107.2Hz. Coverage includes the Stockton area as well as parts of Lodi, Manteca, Tracy and Ripon.
