2012 TURKEY DAY RUN & WALK AGAINST HUNGER NOVEMBER 22, 2012

Several club members braved the early morning cold and the admonishment of a few spouses to support the 8th Annual Run & Walk Against Hunger on Thanksgiving Day morning. The club provided much needed communication support for the event. We were the "eyes and ears" of race day organizer who appreciated our help on delivering a nearly flawless event. The annual run benefits the Stockton/San Joaquin County Emergency Food Bank and I personally saw two separate truckloads of food leave the parking lot at the end of the event.

Event organizers reported over 3500 registered participants on the 5K & 10K courses which followed the Stockton waterfront through downtown around the Weber event center and back to the Banner Island Ball Park.



The net was started at 0700 by John, NZ6Q & Ed, N6XMA as net control operators. We set up net control by the event sign-in tables in front of the Banner Island Ball Park. Our crew was strategically placed around the course at each turn. Stockton PD closed off Fremont St, part of Center St, and Weber Ave.

The event started at 0800 with a Kid's ¹/₄ Mile Fun Run. The "official" race start was at 0830 with 5K Walkers, 5K Runners and 10K Runners. Walkers enjoyed the scenic waterfront path while 5K runners and 10K runners took to the streets.

Operations were conducted on the K6KJQ 444.325 repeater located on top of the police station downtown. We enjoyed flawless HT coverage on the course. At net control, Paul, N6KZW donated his "Go-Station" for use as net control. Ed and I ended up splitting operations between the go station and HT work as several times we needed to consult the large course map which was set up behind us by the entrance to the ball park – just out of sight from our position. (note for improvement next year – be closer to the big map!)

ANNOUNCING A NEW CLUB UHF REPEATER ON THE AIR

If you haven't had an opportunity to check it out, you're missing out! Thanks to the planning of our new board member, Glenn, K6KJQ and with a lot of hard work, the club is proud to announce the "birth" of a new W6SF UHF Repeater in Stockton.


The repeater hardware has been donated to the club by Knox, K6NOX. The new repeater is located on Knox's tower in downtown Stockton at about 170 feet above ground. Knox is also donating the space in his communication center for the repeater.

We've been conducting a lot of testing and have been able to hit the repeater 'mobile' in Modesto and Elk Grove. Portable (HT) coverage is excellent in Stockton and there have been several excellent reports. Paul, N6KZW reported that he could wake up in the morning, turn on his HT and hit the repeater before even getting out of bed. (HIHI). So far, we've been able to work the repeater on an HT as far north as the Sacramento county line, west well out into the Delta, southwest toward Tracy and south along the 120 bypass (HT in car), southeast to Ripon and east to the Calaveras County line.

Further enhancements are planned to expand the portable (HT) coverage footprint including voting receivers in Stockton, Lodi and toward Manteca.

Thank you again to Glen, K6KJQ who found the frequency (coordination pending) and has been really driving the project.

Also, thank you to Knox, K6NOX for the huge gift of equipment, Eric, W6INP for his donation to pay for the 444.575 crystals, Paul, N6KZW for coordinating the initial testing, and Peter, KD6CPA for getting the coordination submitted to NARCC.



That's right! The end is finally near. According to one of the three Mayan Calendars, the End of the world will occur on December 21, 2012. To celebrate this—literally—once in a lifetime event, Special Event Station N0D (Now Zero Days) will be activated for three days during and possibly after the end of the world. Amateur Radio in Space: NASA Now Accepting Applications for Hosting a Real-Time Conversation with ISS Crewmembers

NASA is now accepting proposals from US schools, museums, science centers and community youth organizations -individually or working together -- to host an Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (<u>ARISS</u>) contact between May 1, 2013 and November 1, 2013. To maximize these radio contact opportunities, NASA is looking for organizations that will draw large numbers of participants and integrate the contact into a well-developed education plan. Radio contacts are approximately 10 minutes in length. ARISS contacts are supported by the program's US partners -- the ARRL and



<u>AMSAT</u> -- and their member volunteers, as well as other international space agencies and Amateur Radio partners. Proposals are due January 28, 2013.

Interested parties can visit the <u>ARRL website</u> or the <u>NASA Teaching From Space website</u> for information about proposal requirements and how to submit a proposal, as well as links to audio and videos of archived contacts. Five information sessions are also available for groups who are considering submitting an ARISS proposal. Access to the Internet and a telephone line are required to connect to a session. Information on how to sign up for these sessions is available on the ARRL and NASA websites.

Newly licensed CW buffs can get their copying skills in shape on Sunday, December 16 as the CW edition of the ARRL Rookie Roundup takes to the airwaves! The Rookie Roundup combines a competitive event with some on-the-air training, with the goal of bringing fun and Elmering into the 21st century. Who is a Rookie? Any amateur licensed for three years or less, regardless of license class. If you received your license in 2010, 2011 or 2012, you're eligible to compete as a Rookie; stations licensed before 2010 can only submit checklogs, but they will be recognized in the final results. Old Timers are encouraged to get on

the air and work the Rookies. This is an immediate, hands-on way to teach good operating practices to those just getting started. The Rookie Roundup is also an excellent activity for clubs, offering a chance for club members to open their doors to those newer club members. Read more here.
