

APRIL MEETING REPORT THURSDAY, APRIL 13TH

The meeting was called to order at 6:30PM by President John **NZ6Q.** After introductions, the Treasurer Paul **KC6RRR** gave his report. The club provided pizza from Eddie's Pizza which was enjoyed by all.

Paul **N6KZW** gave a detailed report on the March ACES Emergency Communication Training. It was a very informative class recommended for all who would like to volunteer as part of a disaster response team or just learn how to be a better resource for public safety agencies. Bob **N6TCE** reported that a few of the ACES manuals were still available for \$20 for purchase. Contact Bob **N6TCE** or David Coursey **N5FDL** if you are interested in purchasing one.

John NZ6Q reported that the Stockton Fire Department had licensed 4 members as ham operators and that a new club was being created for the Fire Department with the call sign W6SFD. Annie N6ACL, Bob N6TCE and Ron N6GKJ were working on setting up the club and acquiring the vanity call sign. Discussions with the fire department on locating a club station and making it available for SDARC Members to use as they assist in training these new hams are

ongoing.

In New Business, club leadership reported that rather than organize a trip to the repeater site for weed whacking, the board elected to pay a professional to bush hog the weeds and spray to inhibit future growth. Steve **K6SCA** was in support of this as it would get the weeds cut earlier in the year and the spray would help keep them at bay through the summer months. Members voted to approve spending \$150 for the work.

Ed **N6XMA** is working on assignments for the 2017 March for Babies in Stockton on April 22nd.

Several members went on a brief tour of Fire Station #2 and the apparatus. FireComm was short staffed tonight and the supervisor could not spare a member of her team to give us a tour of that facility.



Upon returning from the tour, the meeting resumed. Joni from the Blind Center was on hand. She thanked everyone for their participation in the Pedaling Paths to Independence Bike Ride. The event raised \$24,520 for the Center and had a few more registrations come in, that tally would have been over \$25,000. She invited the club to support the 2018 Pedaling Paths Bike Ride on February 24th 2018. This will be the 10th year for this ride. She also thanked the club for our support on the 2017 Delta Century Bike Ride coming up on Sunday May 7th.

Bob **K6DGQ** reported on the World-Wide Marne Radio day being held the coming weekend of April 15th.



Dave **N6LHL** and John **NZ6Q** reported on progress of efforts being put forth to change 23123.5 of the vehicle as written and enacted into law on January 1st. As written the law makes it "technically illegal" to operate your Amateur Radio while in motion. A recent CHP directive which was released on the internet was read stating that the CHPs position was that the law should not be applied to Amateur Radio and other two-way radio users. The internet post encouraged Amateur operators to carry this post in their car and show it an officer if pulled over for using their radio. John **NZ6Q** suggested that this might not be the best idea to try to educate a police officer

on the side of the road and it might be better discussed in court should you get a ticket.

The meeting adjourned at 8:00PM without the raffle. The 50/50 raffle will resume in the May meeting.

Renewing an Expired License

Renewing or Modifying your Amateur Radio License

FCC Registration Number (FRN):

As many of you know I am the Laurel VE Team Leader in addition to being a ARRL Field Stocked VE.

Recently at one of examination sessions, a person presented his expired and out of the two year "grace period" General Class License.

After a quick rereading of my VEC's Policy and Procedures and a quick review of the rules in Part

97.505 Element credit, I found after he passed a new Element 2 Examination he would have his General Class License restored. The Laurel Software Session Manager system actually led me correctly through the process. I helped John Litz do the same thing for an Advanced Class License last year inside the "two year grace period. It was not anywhere as easy for VE Liaison to navigate. The only drawback he saw was he didn't get his old call sign back automatically, but I showed him how easy it would be to request his old sign back, because it has not been reassigned.

If anyone knows a person which has an expired license and they want to get a general class or better license, the solution is simple. Take and pass the Technician (Element 2) written examination, present valid proof of the prior license, and proper identification, Then when the application is processes is completed and everything is entered into the FCC ULS database you'll find all your prior privileges restored.

A good write up is found here" Exam Element Credit.

As a side note, I get frequently asked about the so called "Super Tech License" issued for a period prior to March 21, 1987. The explanation is on the ARRL web site and many other places. Basically the "Super Tech" was a class of license between the Novice Class and General, in which the person took and passed the **General Class Written Examination** but didn't pass the General Class Code Test. Starting on March 21,1987 a different written test was given. When a person present proof they had a Tech license issue prior to March 19, 1987. They are given credit for Element 3 Examination, which is the General class written test given prior to March 21, 1987.

The ARRL web site above gives this great explanation which places the burden of proving evidence on the applicant alone. FCC Rule 97.505(a) offers partial credit to pre-1987 Technician licenses. If an applicant held a "Technician" prior to 3/21/1987, and has proof, the FCC will afford credit for the General (Element 3) written exam only. The FCC does not require the applicant to have been continuously licensed. At VE exam sessions it is the applicant (not the VEs or coordinating VEC) who is responsible for supplying the evidence of holding valid grandfather credit.

There is a section on that web page which explains just gives what sort of evidence is valid for the consideration of the VE Liaison or Team Leader.

So if you know anyone with an expired Tech Plus, General Advance or Extra class amateur license, we are able to help him either renew inside the 2 year grace period or administer a Element 2 Examination and restore his old class of license.





MARCH FOR BABIES EVENT – SATURDAY APRIL 22nd

The March of Dimes March for Babies was Saturday April 22nd on the Pacific Ave Miracle Mile. Over a million people in 900 communities participate in March for Babies raising millions of dollars each year.

Parachute Mobile Mission 26 is set for May 13, 2017. Make a contact with a skydiver and receive a one-of-a-kind QSL card.

WHERE: We will be conducting our Mission from Bay Area Skydiving, Byron Airport, Byron, CA.

TIME: We hope to have our first jump sometime between 9:30 and 10:30 A.M. We are usually able to make 3 to 5 jumps for the day.

FREQUENCIES: QSO frequency will be 146.430 MHz simplex. We will also be dedicating one jump for D-star. Locally, D-Star will be via the W6CX C repeater on Mount Diablo, output 145.000, input 147.500, reflector REF014 C. Plans are to conduct an HF jump on 20 meters at 14.250MHz.

Updates: On mission day, updates will be made by "Parachute Control", a team located on top of Mount Diablo. Use the QSO frequency to contact them. Periodic repeater updates will be made on the W6CX repeater located on Mount Diablo, 147.060+ 100.

WEBSITE/Facebook: On mission day we will post jump updates here on the website and on Facebook.

STREAMING VIDEO: Ground video and air-to-ground video will be will be available. To watch the excitement unfold go to http://www.ustream.tv/channel/mfwright.

Facebook Live: Periodic Facebook live broadcast may happen throughout the day so be sure to follow us on Facebook.

APRS: View live APRS data during each jump. Along with altitude and speed there will also be biotelemetry from the jumper that will include heart rate and SpO2 (blood oxygen level). Just search for the jumper's call sign at APRS.Fi.

Feel free to come by the DZ and say "Hi" and check out our operation.
