There was also a big selection of desserts to be had. Cakes, cookies, brownies and cheesecake just to name a few.

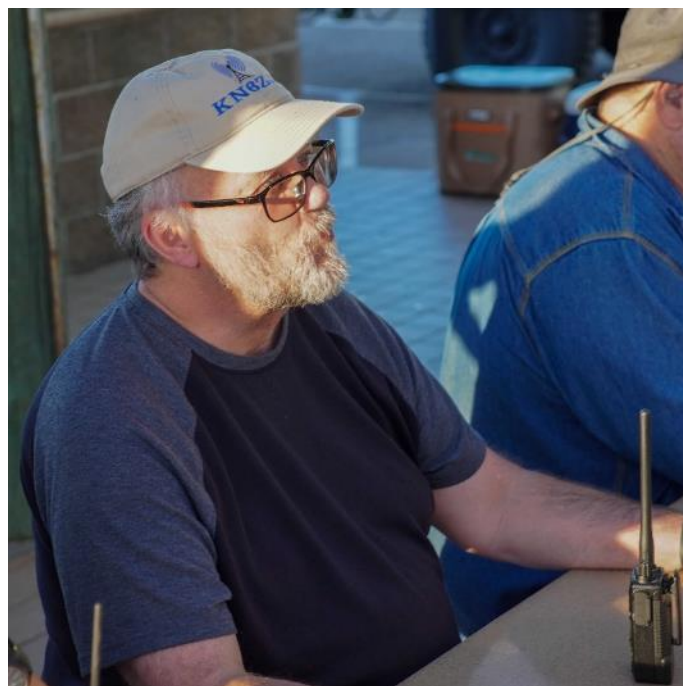

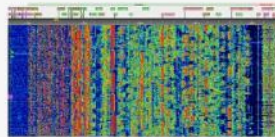

W1AW Remote Operation returns to California ***October 10th – 17th*** ***On-The-Air***

As a part of the Year of the Volunteer celebration, the mystical callsign W1AW will be traveling to the corners of ARRL-land. ARRL members in each state/territory will be asked to operate their stations for two different weeks using the callsign W1AW/x where x is one of the local regions: 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, KL, KH0, KH2, KH6, KH7, KH8, KP2, KP3, or KP4. For example, California's first week starts Feb 15 2023, at 0000z and will run through January 31, 2023, at 2359z, using the callsign W1AW/6. Each state will coordinate the time/band/mode slots throughout the week and hams will be able to operate their own station as W1AW/6.

Each state W1AW coordinator will make a schedule to optimize the on-air time for those interested in running the callsign. Contact John NZ6Q if you would like to be W1AW/6 between October 10th through the 17th nz6q@arrl.net

I will send you a link to the sign-up page and you can select your operating 2-hour time slots for voice, CW or digital modes. The sign-up page also gives you the rules and requirements for sending a logbook afterwards.

This is a great opportunity to get on the air and have some fun, maybe earn a W1AW Worked-All-States Certificate, talk to the President of the ARRL (I did during the Centennial QSO Party in 2014), meet a bunch of new people and learn more about the hobby while you're doing it.

National Fire Prevention Week **Special Event** **October 8th – 14th** **On-The-Air**



On behalf of the Stockton Fire Department Amateur Radio Club, W6SFD, you're invited to participate as the special event station N6F. You may operate Voice, Data (including FT8), or CW depending on your license privileges. You will be using the call N6F for this event. "CQ CQ N6F Fire Prevention Week Special Event Station". Please remember a special event call does not impart any operating privileges. You must operate within your own license privileges or that of a control operator, if present. All N6F stations must transmit from within California. The rules require giving out the call of the holder of N6F once an hour, so give out your call (i.e. NZ6Q) at least once an hour (see instructions).

Please also announce a fire safety tip as often as possible, that is the main point of this event. There is a link to the safety tips at www.hamfire.com Sign-up page will be online soon. There should be only one station on the same band/mode at the same time. Therefore, select available band/mode slots on the signup sheet and operate only those you have selected. You can select pre-planned times or look for and select any available times during the event. If there is a call entered in a slot, you should assume they are on whether you can hear them or not. If for some reason you are not able to operate at a time previously selected, please remove your call from the signup sheet so it will be available for someone else.
